

### Lock down teaching expectations if we have to close a bubble

This really is the last thing any of us want. However it might happen and I would rather be as prepared as possible if it does.

If we have to close a bubble we would lose

- Year 5 and 6 as one bubble
- Year 1 and 2 we can just lose the class where the infected child is.
- Year 3 we would lose the whole year
- Year 4 we would lose the whole year
- Reception we would lose all three classes.

If you have siblings at the school, they would not have to stay at home unless it was your child who actually had a positive test or the sibling was displaying symptoms.

If a bubble had to stay off it would be for 14 days.

The teachers (unless ill themselves and then it will one of the leadership team) will provide daily maths, reading and writing lessons. This will be done on a strict timetable. The teachers will lead the learning through Zoom. The worksheets will be on DB primary like last time. There will also be work set on My Maths.

The children will need access to a device that lets them watch the teaching on Zoom. This could be a lap top, a tablet or i-pad even a phone. They will need to be able to print off the work or do it on a lap top. This will be sent in advance so you can have the work ready for the day. If your children are in reception the sessions will be shorter but still live on Zoom.

You need to make sure that you can log into DB Primary and My Maths- if in juniors.

It would really help if you made sure you access Zoom before any potential issue. The link for each days teaching will be emailed to the DB Primary account.

We realise that there will be pressure with devices if you are working from home but with all the disruption they have already had we would really need to avoid children missing work.

The Learning Support Assistants will also be available to support children who are finding the learning hard. This will be done over the phone or via Zoom.

Unfortunately if your child is in a bubble that goes down there will not be a key worker group although you can still go to work unless your child displays symptoms.
